Amanda (Mandy) Scott '87

Mandy was the first female cadet selected to Corps Staff, and the first female to serve as Deputy Corps Commander. She was one of the first two females inducted into the Ross Volunteer Company, and received numerous awards and recognition on campus.

Mandy presently serves as the first woman president of the Ross Volunteer Association (RVA), and has been on its board since 2013. She has also held leadership positions in the Corps of Cadets Association, and was a speaker for the 40th Anniversary of Women in the Corps program in 2015. Mandy's involvement in both the CCA and RVA has allowed her to mentor many current cadets, women and men, over the past six years. Mandy is an active participant and panel member in the annual Corps Women Forum. Mandy's past accomplishments and current mentoring within the Corps and its leadership are providing a positive impact for each new class of students, especially women, in the Corps.

Mandy married David Scott (Class of 1988) and took on the tasks of a military spouse. She earned her MBA at Texas Tech while her husband was in pilot training at Reese Air Force Base in Lubbock. Mandy began her career at Tenneco Gas in Houston, and later served as Associate Director of Alumni Relations at McMurry University in Abilene.

Mandy now serves as mom, military spouse, and community volunteer. She has held various leadership positions in the Dyess AFB and Little Rock AFT Officer's Spouses Clubs, as well as Meals on Wheels, the Abilene Community Band, and her neighborhood HOA, as well as her local church.

Mandy has been an active member of the San Antonio A&M Club and has served on its board since 2015, presently as Vice President of Programs. She chaired the most recent Muster event, and will be the club President in 2019. She has also served on the board of the San Antonio Aggie Mom's Club while her son, Braden (class of 2016) was at A&M.
