Previously, she spent over 12 years in the banking industry, most notably as Vice President of United Citizens Bank of College Station.

Glenda is currently the Vice Chairperson of the Texas Residential Construction Commission, former President of the Bryan/College Station Homebuilders Association, former Vice Chair of the Bryan/College Station Convention and Visitors Bureau and in 1996 received the Builder of the Year award from the Bryan/College Station Homebuilders Association. In 2007 the National Association of Homebuilders recognized her as a Certified Graduate Builder
